## GETTING TO KNOW THE FIRST LASALLIAN PARTNER CHANCELLOR

Dr. Elsie Lavezaris Dajao joined Immaculate Conception College on June 1, 1988 as a high school English and History teacher. Her thirty years of dedicated service to this institution has helped chart the course of this institution.

A native of Ozamiz City, Dr. Dajao went to Misamis University for her basic education and graduated as the class salutatorian, she finished her secondary education at Ozamiz City National High School as the class valedictorian.

Dr. Dajao earned her baccalaureate degree in Education, major in English, minor in History from Immaculate Conception College in 1988. After graduation, she taught English and History in her alma mater's high school department and also taught English subjects at the college unit. Two years after her stint at the high school department, she was re-assigned to the college unit, where she taught basic English grammar, literature, speech, linguistics, and history. She also made herself consistently available in the delivery of guidance services, as resource speaker, during Career Enhancement Seminars for graduating students. She has also helped set the direction of the present Student Media Group; from 1997 to 2003, Dr. Dajao served as Editor In Chief of ICC-La Salle's Newsletter; for six years. Dr. Dajao also religiously taught Night High School classes year after year as a volunteer English teacher since the unit opened.

In 2002, moved by her great desire to be of greater service to the University, she pursued post-graduate studies, and earned for herself a Master of Arts in English, Major in Literature Teaching degree, from Immaculate Conception College - La Salle. In that same year, she was appointed as Coordinator of the Languages Department and Editor of the Faculty Research Journal. Eight summers after, she was appointed as the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, by the newly installed President, Br. Jaime Dalumpines FSC second President of the University. In 2013, inspired by the Founder's commitment to the delivery of quality education, Dr. Dajao earned her Doctor of Arts in Literature and Communication degree from Cebu Normal University. Her most recent assignment is a testimony to her unparalleled zeal, having served as Vice Chancellor for Academics and Research of this University.

Dr. Elsie Dajao's wisdom is a product of three decades of academic and leadership experience. Her track record shows she is an active and efficient leader who encourages innovation, promotes synergy and inclusiveness, and demonstrates a zealous commitment to academic excellence and student success.
